
Friday, Sept. 15, 2023 (the fourth Friday of the semester):

Last day to **drop** a full semester course without receiving a W (withdrawn) on the student's record

Last day to drop a full semester course using online registration

- Maintain a minimum 3.0 GPA
- Make reasonable progress to degree



Final Semester

A graduate student's last semester of enrollment is also his or her semester of graduation. Graduating students are responsible for meeting important milestones and deadlines.

Dissertation and Theses

Examinations

Graduate degree examinations are a major milestone in all graduate students' pursuit of their graduate degree. Much hinges on the successful completion of these examinations, including the ability to continue in a graduate program.

The rules and processes set by the Graduate School ensure the integrity of these examinations for graduate students, the graduate faculty and for Ohio State. Graduate students are expected to follow all rules and processes pertaining to examinations. Please see below for more information on deadlines, and degree rules for different graduate degree types.

Prior to scheduling an exam, students must coordinate with their advisor and examination committee to determine a mutually acceptable date and time for the oral exam. Exams must take place during university business hours, Monday through Friday. Exams may be held on Ohio State's campus or via video conference, dependent upon unanimous agreement by the student and committee

Doctoral Examinations

All PhD and DMA degrees require a candidacy examination and a final examination. Some graduate programs also require a preliminary examination.

Professional Doctoral Examination

Professional doctorate students must submit their Application for Professional Exam via GRADFORMS and have this approved by their program and advisor at least two weeks prior to the proposed exam date.

The master's examination is administered under the auspices of the local program's graduate studies committee.

Dissertations and Theses

The dissertation is the hallmark of the research expertise demonstrated by a doctoral student. It is a scholarly contribution to knowledge in the student's area of specialization. By researching and writing a dissertation, the student is expected to demonstrate a high level of knowledge and the capability to function as an independent scholar.

A thesis is a hallmark of some master's programs. It is a piece of original research, generally less comprehensive than a dissertation, and is meant to show the student's knowledge of an area of specialization.

Document Preparation

PhD and master's students are responsible for meeting all requirements for preparing theses and dissertations. They are expected to confer with their advisors about disciplinary and program expectations and to follow Graduate School procedure requirements.

The Graduate School's format review is in place to help the document submission process go smoothly for the student. This format check must be done in person at 247 University Hall and cannot be accomplished electronically. The format review is required at or before the two-week notice of the final defense.

Applications to Graduate are initiated by grad students

If you are planning to graduate in Autumn 2023:

Application to Graduate, Due 3rd Friday: Sept. 8, 2023

Advisor and GSC chair (Dr. Qu) approval (but you need to list entire committee on the form)



Communicate with your advisor and GSC Chair before submitting the Gradform.

Advisor and the GSC chair (Feng Qu) will get an e-mail with a link to the form (for approval).

Then, YOU can MONITOR the progress of your Gradform.

On the Gradform, "End of Semester" means you will finish after the graduation deadline but before first day of Spring semester.

The End-of-Semester deadline for the exam and thesis/dissertation is January 5, 2023.

Do *not* check $\sqrt{\ }$ End-of-Semester option unless you are planning for that option.

If it turns out that you can't complete degree requirements by the graduation deadline, just contact the Grad School. You can still use the End-of-Semester option.

This is the Gradform to add external faculty to your Final Examination Committee

For Ph.D. Exams, you'll need the CV of your external member

On the form, explain WHY (expertise of the member) and indicate their availability (e.g., USDA labs colocated in same building on campus, or readily available via Zoom)

Scheduling your Exit Seminar and Oral Exam

Work with your committee to determine your final seminar date + oral exam.

- Schedule a room reservation

For PhD students (but not required for M.S. students): You must submit the *Application for Final Exam* (Gradform) 2 weeks before your Oral Exam date

For PhD students

Application for Final Exam

Need committee approval 2 weeks before Oral Defense

MS and PhD students Give your committee members at least 2 weeks to go over your thesis/dissertation before the final exam.

For PhD students, that means you'll need to have dissertation done 4 weeks before your planned Oral Defense.

If you are planning to take the candidacy exam this year

PhD Candidacy Exam

- Candidacy exam: minimum 4 Graduate Faculty members, including your advisor (Graduate School rule)
 - Graduate faculty are generally the tenure-track faculty who are approved to serve as graduate advisors and committee members
 - You can have more than 4 members
 - You can also add external members (e.g. USDA, or non-OSU faculty)

 - Establish dates for the written exam and the oral exam (oral exam normally 2-4 weeks after the written exam)

After you pass your candidacy exam:

You can file for an **MS in Plant Pathology** on the basis of passing your candidacy exam –

To do this, you must fill out an Application to Graduate (gradforms.osu.edu)

Forms need to be *approved* (by all who need to approve it) by the DEADLINE!

Discuss with your SAC: the format (grant proposal or examination format Submit Committee and Examination Petition (if needed) (Gradform) Establish dates for the Written Exam and the Oral Exam Schedule room reservations Submit Application for Candidacy at least 2 weeks before the Oral Exam (Gradform)
